Tuesday morning, 8:18 am, I received an email from our new dean asking for a statement regarding the loss of one of our board members, Connie. Connie's death was not a surprise, unfortunately, as she had been sick for some time. Throughout the day, I called her peers and colleagues, gaining perspective on her beautiful influence in the Philadelphia community.

At 3:30 pm, I was scheduled to meet with the Chancellor. When I called him, his voice broke, "Your president has died. Please advise your dean."

It took me a moment to process what he just said. President Epps, the University's acting leader, collapsed at an event. I had just seen her on Saturday and met her face-to-face for the first time. The news of her sudden passing ripped through the dean suite in the first wave of grief.

The hymns for Sunday, September 24 were reflective of the Philadelphia community grieving. All of these hymns look at the triumph in the face of death.

Abide with Me: I fear no foe, with Thee at hand to bless; Ills have no weight, and tears no bitterness. Where is death's sting? Where, grave, thy victory? I triumph still, if Thou abide with me.
